

LEVEL Youth Policy Program

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<u>Vancouver Foundation</u> is a community foundation that connects the generosity of donors with the energy, ideas and time of people in the community. We bring together donors, non-profits and charities, government, media and academic institutions, local leaders, and passionate individuals to build meaningful and lasting change in the province of British Columbia.

LEVEL is a youth engagement initiative of Vancouver Foundation that aims to address racial inequity. We do this by investing in the leadership capacity of Indigenous and racialized immigrant and refugee youth and creating more opportunities throughout the non-profit and charitable sector.

The LEVEL Youth Policy Program brings together young people between the ages of 19 and 29 from across British Columbia who identify as being Indigenous or racialized immigrants or refugees. Indigenous and racialized newcomer youth are disproportionately impacted by certain public policies, but may rarely be included in the development and implementation of public policy process. The LEVEL YPP aims to provide these young leaders with equitable training and leadership opportunities to navigate the public policy landscape, and develop new tools and skills to influence, shape, and advocate for policy changes that are relevant in their own communities. Having young people directly involved in shaping policies that impact their lives is essential to creating systemic, meaningful change.

The Youth Policy Program starts in February and ends in September of 2020.

The program includes six two-day modules and we ask participants to commit to all six modules of the program. Most modules take place in Vancouver other than Module 4, which will take place in Victoria.

- » Module 2: Public Policy in British Columbia Mar. 12th & 13th
- » Module 3: Different Levels of Government including Indigenous Governance – Apr. 16th & 17th
- » Module 4: Stakeholder Analysis and Budget Cycles (in Victoria) May 14th & 15th
- » Module 5: Storytelling, New Narratives, and Policy in Action Jun. 18th & 19th
- » Module 6: Learning and Reflections. Public Presentations of Final Projects – Sept. 24th & 25th
