8. Other Important Resources

- "Think tanks" create research on a wide variety of public policy topics. Be aware that these organizations usually have political leanings that are not clearly disclosed, and this may affect how their research is viewed by policy makers. Three examples
 - o <u>BC Centre for Policy Alternatives</u> (NDP leaning)
 - Smart Prosperity Institute (Liberal leaning)
 - <u>Canada West Foundation</u> (Conservative leaning)
- **Labour unions** often have excellent research and resource libraries. Not all of them are publicly available so it's worth asking if you have allies in a union but can't find a research library online. A good example of publicly accessible one is <u>CUPE national</u>
- Similar to labour unions, **industry associations and non profit organizations** also often invest in research. Two good examples of that:
 - Vancouver Foundation Connect and Engage Survey 2017
 - o BC CleanTech 2019 Status Report
- There is a complex set of issues to navigate in relation to **Indigenous knowledge**, data sovereignty and research.
 - These issues are explored at <u>UBC's Indigenous Research Support Initiative</u> and are boiled down well in the <u>OCAP principles</u>. Before embarking on research by or about Indigenous people it is important to understand the key concepts outlined in these documents.
 - The <u>UBCIC's Digital Collections</u> offer a variety of research and informational materials. There are four research collections in addition to a series of collections created with digitized materials from the UBCIC Archives that document the history of the UBCIC and First Nations in British Columbia.
